




FACIAL IDENTIFICATION TRAINING (F.I.T.)

300 Series Courses

Fit for those Needing a Refresher

Each of our 2-day refresher classes requires that the student has taken one of the 200 level classes (or an equivalent – must provide evidence of other class/training for approval). We offer 3 unique refresher class options that range from a general review to subjects such as how juveniles age or differences in populations.



Here is what you can expect from all of our 300 level Refresher Courses:

- ▲ A small class size (12:1 student to instructor ratio)
- ▲ Updates on current standards/guidelines
- ▲ A review of the morphological features of the face & their stability, comparison methodologies, as well as a review of how to document a comparison
- ▲ Opportunities to conduct comparisons on known data sets with class reviews and feedback from the instructor to help address annual training

F.I.T. 301 Refresher - General Review

Participants can expect to further develop their skillset with this general review that offers pertinent information and updates relevant to the Facial Identification practice with a focus on adult-to-adult comparisons.



F.I.T. 302 Refresher - Comparing Juvenile Images



This refresher class offers the same standard review as in our 301 - General Review course with an additional concentration on juvenile to juvenile and juvenile to adult comparisons.

F.I.T. 303 Refresher - Population Variations

Participants will receive the same key information discussed in our 301 - General Review course while focusing on the differences that are present amongst different populations.
